When children or families have to move from their home country to another country because their lives are in danger, they are called. . .

But think about it a little further...

What if...

The people who were hurting your family are **really** mean and angry. They are not letting you live in your home, you are not getting food, you can't go to school or see your friends, and there is even a chance that someone you love may die. Everyone is hungry, scared, and not sure how to get to a place that is safe without getting hurt.

FYI

There are lots of countries where children and their families are not safe because of things like war, violence, or natural disasters. These families are trying to go somewhere else where they can be safe, but it is not easy.

- Sometimes a family cannot find a safe country or a new home.
- Sometimes it costs too much for a family to travel.
- Sometimes a family has to split up because it costs too much to stay together.
- Sometimes a family has to split up because it is more dangerous to try and leave together.

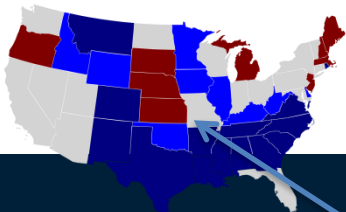
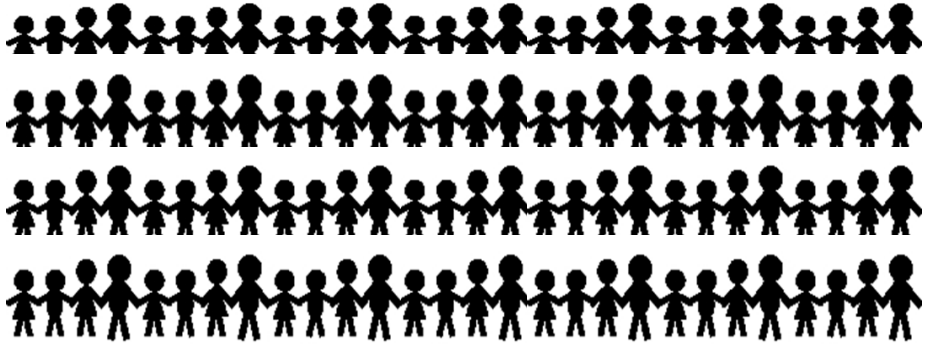

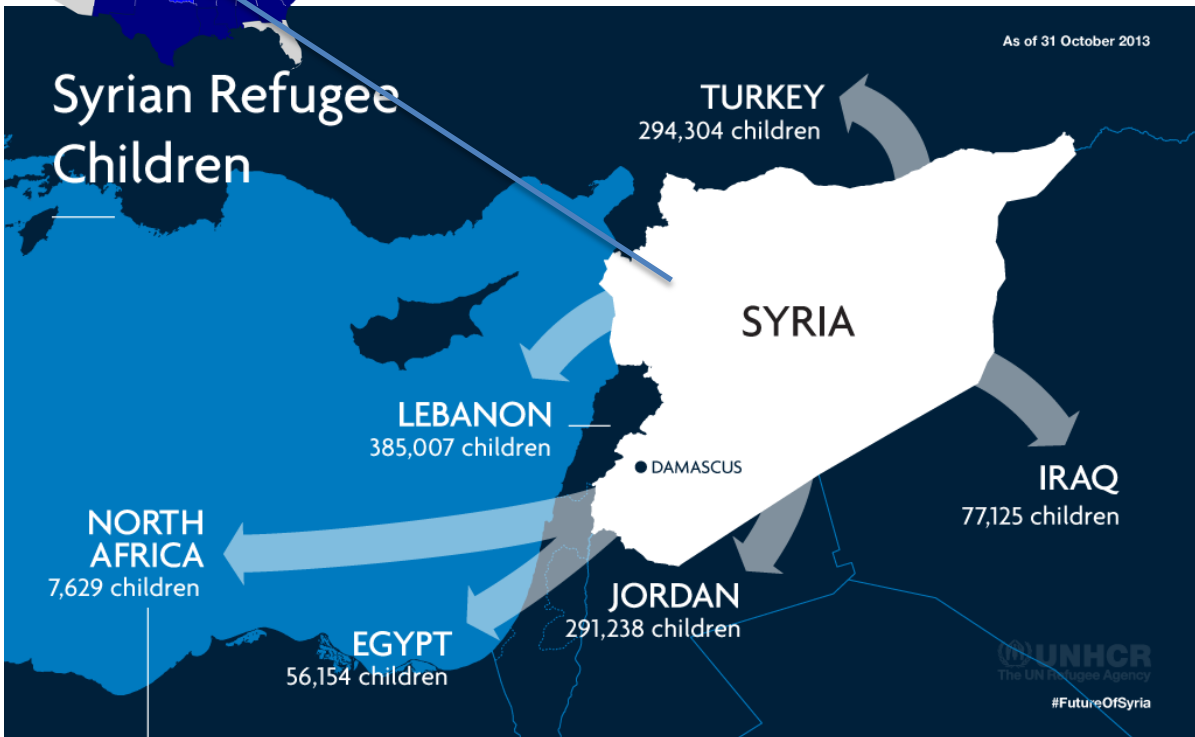

Prayer

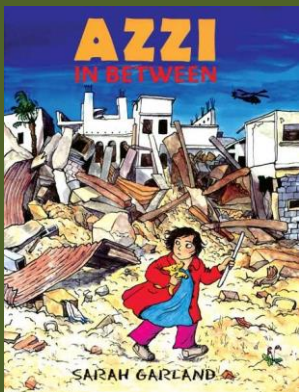
Dear God, help those people who have had to leave their homes. May you help them find new homes that are safe and loving places with good people, like me. In Jesus Name, Amen.

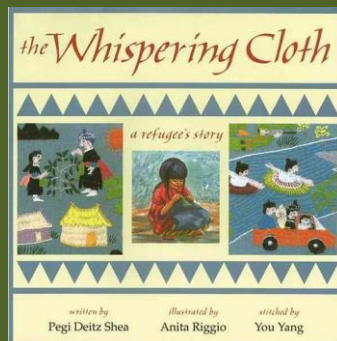

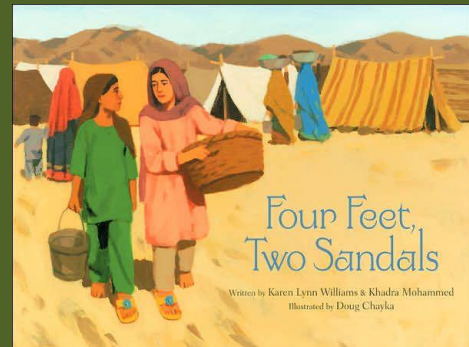
Children's stories are a great way to understand what it means to be a REFUGEE. Check out your local library and look online. Make sure to share the stories with your family, church, and friends.

MAKE REFUGEE WELCOME KITS

BEDDING KITS



- 2 pillows
- 2 pillow cases
- 1 queen (other) sheet set
- 1 quilt/bedspread

BATH KITS



- 2 bath towels
- 2 hand towels
- 2 wash cloths
- 6 bars soap
- 2 toothbrushes & toothpaste

SCHOOL KITS



- 1 backpack, 2 notebooks
- 100 sheets paper
- 2 bottles glue
- 2 packages crayons
- 2 pair scissors
- 4 pencils, 4 pens

(Note: School kit items should be new. Bedding & bath towels may be gently used. Items above are appreciated as a part of suggested "kits" OR in bulk quantities.)

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KNOW EVERYONE'S BASIC HUMAN RIGHTS

Read the flyer on the right. Talk with your parents or adults at church about these rights.

- How have you experienced these rights?
- Have you ever had these rights taken away?
- Do you know others whose rights have been taken away?
- What do you think you can do to help that?

The Universal Declaration of HUMAN RIGHTS

Adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations in 1948, the Universal Declaration states basic rights and fundamental freedoms to which all human beings are entitled.

WE ARE ALL BORN FREE AND EQUAL
EVERYONE IS ENTITLED TO THESE RIGHTS
NO MATTER YOUR RACE, RELIGION OR NATIONALITY

EVERYONE HAS THE RIGHT TO LIFE, FREEDOM AND SAFETY

You have the responsibility to respect the rights of others
NO ONE CAN TAKE AWAY ANY OF YOUR RIGHTS

No one has the right to hold you in slavery.

You have the right to own property.

No one has the right to torture you.

Everyone has the right to belong to a religion.

You have the right to recognition everywhere as a person before the law.

Freedom of Expression: You have the right to free thought and to voice your opinions to others.

We are all equal before the law and are entitled to equal protection of the law.

Everyone has the right to gather as a peaceful assembly.

You have the right to seek legal help if your rights are violated.

You have the right to help choose and to take part in governing your country, directly or through chosen representatives.

No one has the right to wrongly imprison you or force you to leave your country.

You have the right to a fair and public trial.

Everyone is innocent until **PROVEN** guilty.

You have the right to privacy. No one can interfere with your reputation, family, home or correspondence.

Workers' rights: Every adult has the right to a job, a fair wage and to join a trade union.

You can travel wherever you want.

You have the right to leisure and rest from work.

You have the right to seek asylum in another country if you are being persecuted in your own country.

Everyone has the right to an adequate standard of living for themselves and their family.

Everyone has the right to education.

Everyone has the right to a nationality.

Your intellectual property as an artist or scientist should be protected.

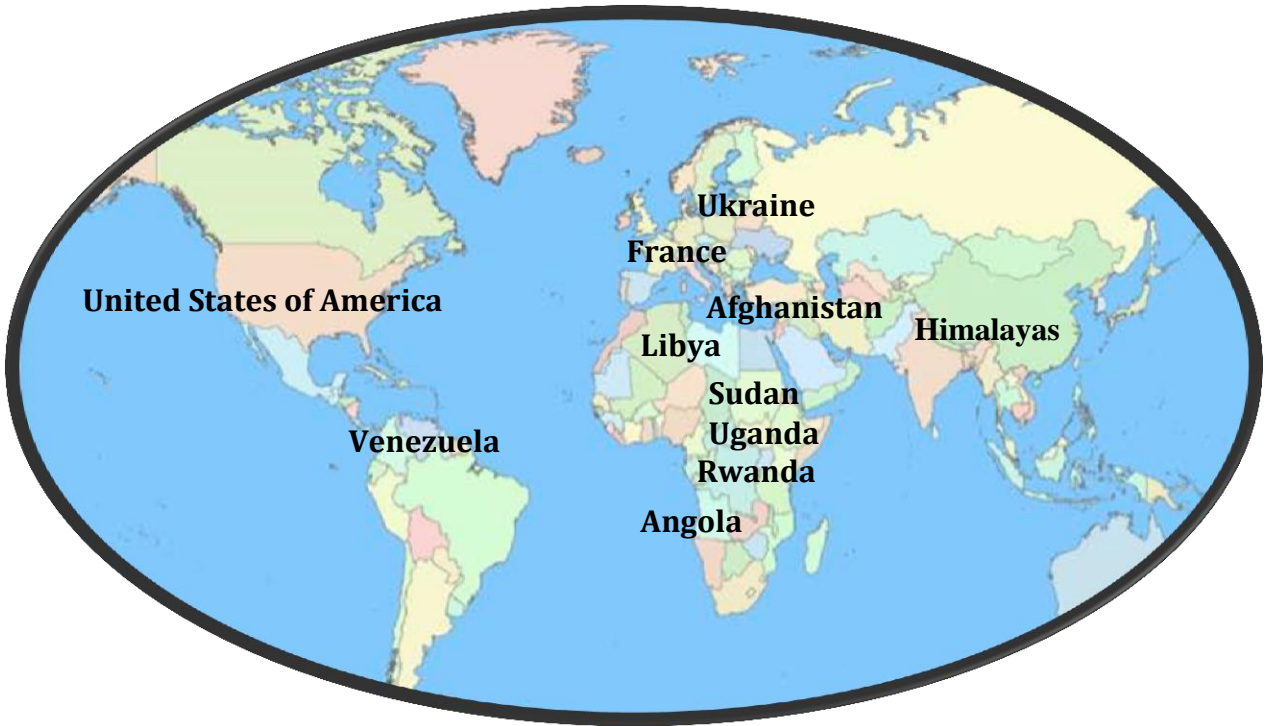
All adults have the right to marriage and to raise a family.
